- Able to intervene in non-violent situations when interventions are needed for socially appropriate behaviors
- Knowledge of conflict resolution and positive reinforcement techniques
- Assist with program monitoring and quality improvement efforts as needed
- Assists in integrating technology in the classroom as needed, i.e. help setting up desktops, zoom, and various HDTV equipment.
